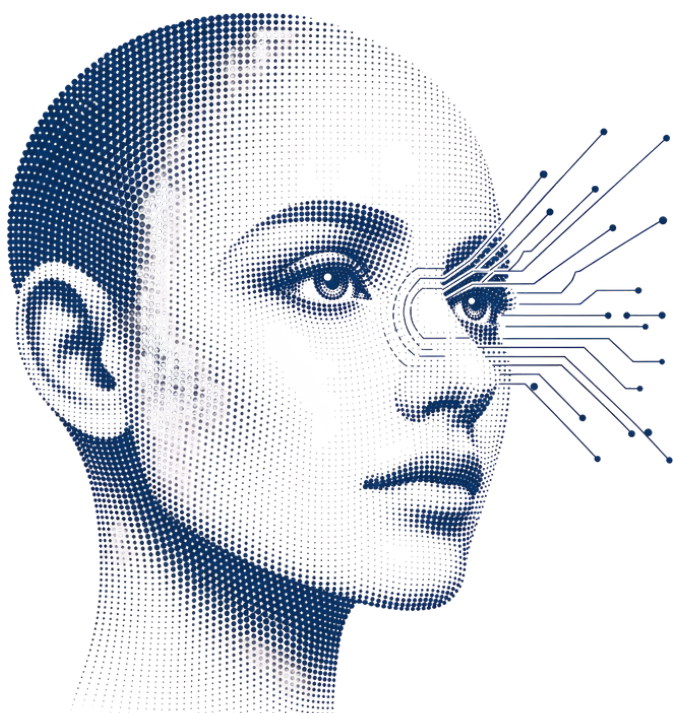

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Third Transnational meeting in Italy



On 21-22 April 2026, the TrustAI consortium met in Turin, Italy, hosted by the University of Turin, to review progress and prepare for the final project phase.

Highlights from the meeting included:

- Planning of pilot testing activities with higher education lecturers and students from the humanities;
- productive discussions on the development of the TrustAI Sustainability and Transferability Roadmap, ensuring the project's results continue to benefit higher education institutions well beyond the project's lifetime;
- planning the final dissemination activities and next steps towards embedding trustworthy and ethical AI into humanities education.
